TOWN OF ACTON SELECTMEN'S MEETING April 25, 2006

1. PUBLIC FORUM: Dennis Long reported there are still problems on Flat Ground Road with vandalism and leaving trash. He also suggested with the high price of fuel selectmen might allow cutting wood on Town owned property.

Steve Bodkin reported the Town Forest harvest is completed. (Proceeds from sale of timber sale were \$29,474.10.) The crew is now working on the road repairs. There was more wood on the lot then Bodkin had originally estimated. There were several cases of theft and vandalism with over \$1000 in damages. The Sheriff Department was called. They decided the safest way was to remove their equipment daily. Other than that, things went very well.

Courtney Gavin expressed his concern with the moratorium and the damage it can do to property valuation and the danger of it being extended for a long period of time. Percy explained that the moratorium is for 180 days and can only be extended once, by the selectmen, for another 180 days. To extend it further would require another Town Meeting vote.

Corney also expressed his concern with the condition of the Milton Mills Road. Nancy said that selectmen have requested that DOT put it on priority. Road Commissioner Yeaton has also discussed this with DOT.
